Grab some lunch while you are heading around town to looking at the windows and murals...

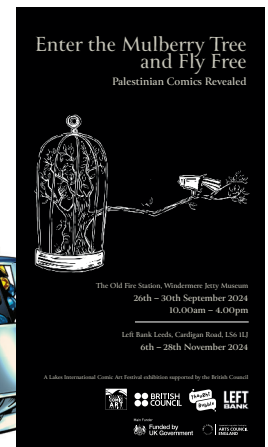

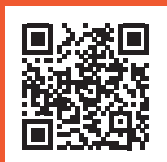
